

Mark Turner's field guides will not disappoint you. I have been waiting for the release of this volume for over a year now, and pre-ordered it as soon as it became possible to do so. It is the perfect bookend to his "Wildflowers of the Pacific Northwest." He covers trees and shrubs from BC to northern California in this volume, so there might be more information than you think you might need, but his thoroughness makes up for having to page through species from out of the reader's

immediate area. As was the case with "Wildflowers," his photographs are as true to color as it is possible to effect. This guide is superb addition to any serious naturalist's bookshelf!

This book is great if you're interested in tree identifying, which I have recently taken up. There are multiple detailed photos and descriptions per tree, which I love. The paper is high quality and while it's big, it is light enough to take out with you for some field work. Downsides: the page numbers don't always line up (it skips from page 224 to page 257, then from 288 to 225) which isn't good for a reference book, as at first you will be depending on the index to find content. Also, I wish they elaborated more on the Willamette Valley, as that's where I'm from - there's more Eastern Oregon shrubs than anything.

Informative and includes a myriad of species, more than I would have imagined. I only gave it 4 stars, vs. 5, due to the not-so-sharp quality of the pictures, which are in color. If the photography had been as sharp as they should have been, then this would have been a stellar, 5 star book. But, it still very good to have, regarding knowledge about the so many types of trees and shrubs there are, here, in the Pacific Northwest, which is surprising to learn and become aware of.

I have always focused on identifying and photographing wildflowers. While on vacation, I stumbled upon *Wildflowers of the Pacific Northwest*, by Mark Turner, at Crater Lake National Park, and it is a wonderful guide. When *Trees and Shrubs of the Pacific Northwest* was released, it was my encouragement to start learning the trees and shrubs!

This companion volume to the *Wildflowers of the Pacific Northwest* is extremely well written and graced with Mark Turner's excellent photographs. This is a great addition to the library of those who enjoy our native trees and shrubs.

Beautiful book, like all the others in the Pacific Northwest series by Timber Press (also check out *Mushroom of the PNW*, and *Wildlife of the PNW*). My collection of books like this is starting to constitute a mini-library, and these are some of my favorites.
