

Let me start my review on a positive note. I liked the plot of this book, and the author did a really good job at telling the story. And the book as a whole was entertaining. It is only for these reasons you got 3 stars. I was originally leaning more towards 2. Now for what I didn't like. Let me start with the characters...I hated them. All of them. They were the most unlikable bunch you could ever come across. Furthermore, I just couldn't "get" the son and his friends. One minute they are horsing around like 12 year old's, and the next minute they're driving around town picking on old people (still acting like a 12 year old, but driving a car). I found them very immature and their never ending banter was grossly annoying. Both sisters were useless characters. So much more, could have been done with the younger one, but the author, for some reason chose to go another route. For future reference, like clowns, children are creepy when it comes to the horror genre. The mother was weak and mindless. What mother repeatedly puts their children in danger the way this woman did through out the whole book. As for the father, I don't even want to think about his idiotic choices. Fella, your house is haunted and your family is in danger! Do you really need to go to work? Now, as for the fright factor...it's laughable. I literally found myself laughing out loud, at what I could only guess were supposed to be scary moments in the book. If I remember correctly, they said that this was based on a true story? How about using the term loosely based. Very, very loosely based. This

was possibly the most far fetched haunted house story I have ever read or even heard of. Some of the incidents were so unbelievable, that it didn't even make sense and it just left me shaking my head. As for the writing itself?

I'm usually on the look-out for a good spooky story, but I ended up skimming the last few chapters. The story started out okay, but 1) the writing was terrible 2) the story needed a good editor as there were many typos and awkward sentence structure. Usually, I'll let a typo or two slide, but I ended up getting irritated with this book. The relating of the story was choppy and there was no lead-in to certain scenes or characters. I ended up back-tracking a few pages to try to see if I had missed something. Example: one moment Tyler, the family's son, enters the house through the front door and then enters the kitchen, only to be surprised by the silent presence of one of the paranormal investigators. A bit of conversation ensues. Then, I next read that somehow Tyler ended up in the living room talking with the same investigator. I asked, 'Now, wait a minute! One minute Tyler's in the kitchen, but now I read that he's in the living room??' Again, there was no explanation of how he ended up in the living room. Yes, I had to assume the obvious, but when you are writing a story, the writer needs to "set the scene" instead of just jumping from one scene to the other. During the scenes which described the exorcism, I said to self, "Really? This sounds too far-fetched to me!" I got the feeling that the author may have felt that the more dramatic the events, the more believable the story would be. I've had my fair share of paranormal experiences, I'm not gullible, do have an open-mind, but I dare say, the skeptic in me crept out.
